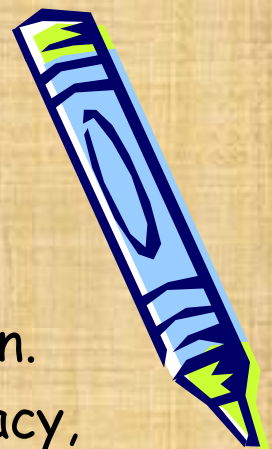
Induction Pack

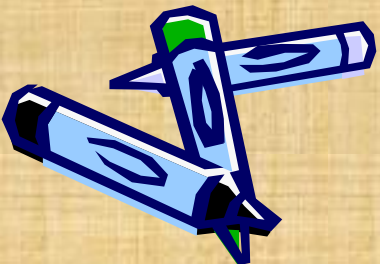
The Importance of Structured Play

They are not just playing, they are learning the life skills they will need to be successful.

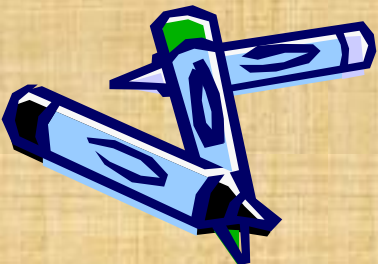




Tapestry

We make it rich and exciting to motivate the children to learn.

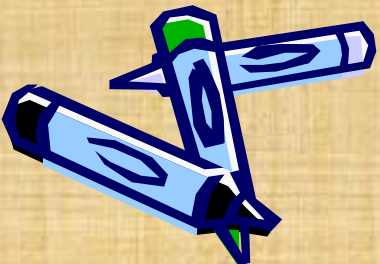




Outdoor learning



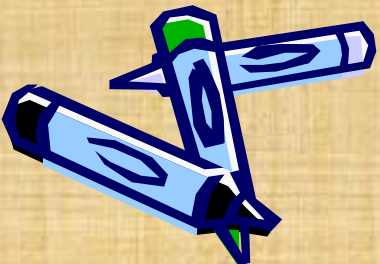
- Berrycroft will take part in a weekly Outdoor Learning session

Induction process

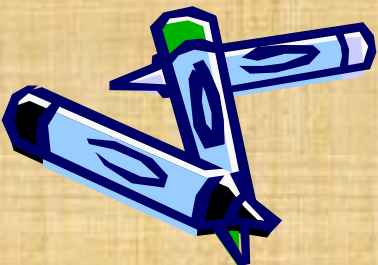


- First day at school - from Tuesday 5th September.

- Please complete the Berrycroft 'All About Me' pack ready for your child to bring in with them in September.



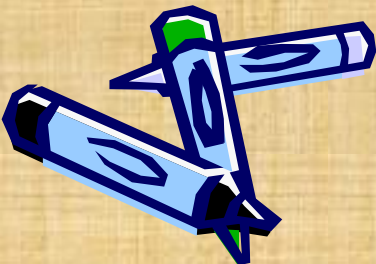
Preparing your child

- Getting dressed and undressed by themselves (they will be expected to do this in PE)
- To be as independent as possible using the toilet
- To manage and use cutlery
- Listening well to a story - share a book everyday
- Recognise their written name
- Count everything
- Develop fine motor skills
- Play games together - sharing and taking turns



Practical details

- Please ensure all clothing, water bottles, lunch boxes, PE kit are labelled with child's name
- Water bottles and lunch boxes need to be clearly named
- Check your child's book bag daily for any notes, letters, pictures etc
- Fruit & milk is provided at snack time
- If someone different is picking your child up, please let us know so we can add their names to Bromcom

11:15am - Phonics (Reception)

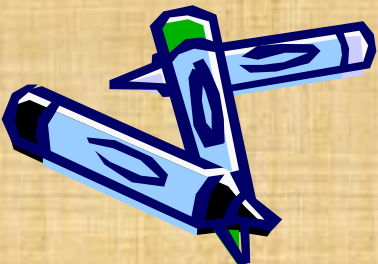
Little Berries morning session ends 11:45am

12:05pm Lunch

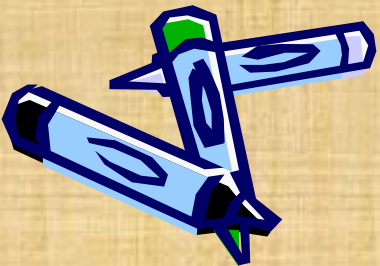
